IB/MYP **CORNERSTONES**

Holistic Learning

Holistic learning emphasizes the links between the disciplines, providing a global view of situations and issues. Students should become aware of the relevance of their learning, and come to see knowledge as an interrelated whole. Students should see the cohesion and complementarity of various fields of study, but this must not be done to the detriment of learning within each of the disciplines, which retain their own objectives and methodology.

Intercultural Awareness

Intercultural awareness is concerned with developing students' attitudes, knowledge and skills as they learn about their own and others' social and national cultures. By encouraging students to consider multiple perspectives, intercultural awareness not only fosters tolerance and respect, but may also lead to empathy.

Communication

Communication is fundamental to learning, as it supports inquiry and understanding, and allows student reflection and expression. The MYP places particular emphasis on language acquisition and allows students to explore multiple forms of expression.

Understanding the importance of intellectual, physical and emotional balance to achieve personal well-being for themselves and others

WHAT IS MY COMMUNITY?

COMMUNITY AND SERVICE

WHAT DOES THIS HAVE TO DO WITH SCHOOL?

Community & Service is one of the five areas of interaction in an International Baccalaureate School. It is one of the lenses through which the Rosa teachers and students view our community and the world. By recognizing the power of each individual to effect change, we hope that the members of our community will make a life-long commitment to service.

HOW DO I USE THIS HANDBOOK?

This handbook is a reference guide for you. It is also for logging your community & service hours and activities. At the end of each marking period you will write a journal entry. The journal entry should state your activities, how you felt about them, how you might improve, and what you might concentrate on in the future.

HOW DO I COMPLETE THE JOURNAL?

To receive credit for your community & service hours, you must complete the log in the center of this booklet and complete **4** journal entries. The log is a simple statement of hours while the journal entry requires you to reflect upon your experience. Both entries require the signature of your contact/supervisor.

Complete the entries as soon as you finish your service. You must log each hour on the chart. However, if you are planning to spend an extended period of time at one organization, log your hours for each visit.
