Dear Parent(s) & Guardian(s):

Basketball tryouts are open to all 6<sup>th</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup>, and 8<sup>th</sup> grade boys and are scheduled to begin on or around November 14, 2016. **No student is permitted to tryout unless all physical / permission forms are approved by the school's nurse. Each parent/guardian is asked to take their child to their private physician for sports physicals or other required physical exams. All physical exams must be on approved district forms. If you do not have a private physician, you may contact the School Nurse or Department of Athletics in your school for assistance.**

All students trying out for the team will be evaluated on their athletic abilities, the needs of the team and their behavior qualities since being coach able is just as important as having the athletic ability to achieve greatness in a sport. Just because a student may have or have not been on the team during the previous school year does not guarantee nor prohibit the chances of making the team this year.

It is important that you and your son take into consideration the time constraints of being on a team before they decide to tryout. If your son makes the team, he will be required to attend practices and games. Sometimes these practices and games run into the evening time when transportation needs to be provided by the parent(s) / guardian(s) of the athlete. Attached for your review is a copy of the Rosa Boys' Basketball Rules with which all of the players will have to comply. Please make sure that your son understands the responsibilities that will come with being part of the team. Failure to comply with these rules will affect the student's playing time.

Lastly, students should also attend tryouts with the knowledge that not all trying out will become part of the school's team. The Basketball team historically has significantly more students trying out than there are spots available and thus, the students should understand that merely trying out for the team does not mean that they will make the team.
